The highlight of the Southern Caribbean itineraries, Antigua Cruise Port is the gateway from Atlantic Ocean to the Caribbean Sea. The capital city of Antigua, St John's is a melting pot of local residents and tourists meandering amongst the many and varied architectural styles of the city. Attractions, restaurants and shops can be found throughout the newly completed complexes with beautiful brightly colored renovated 19th century Caribbean buildings.

Having 410 calls with 791k passengers, Antigua Cruise Port is one of the most preferred cruise destinations in Southern Caribbean. Serving mainly as a transit port to the Southern Caribbean itineraries, Antigua Cruise Port has one terminal with 2 piers that can accommodate up to 4 large ships. With the new project, Antigua Cruise Port will offer a new retail area, F&B, security and parking services, as well as a new terminal that is optimized for passenger flow.

In 2019, Antigua Cruise Port has joined the Global Ports Holding network, representing the 2nd port it operates in its Caribbean expansion.

Antigua & Barbuda are two green giant islands that are surrounded with crystal clear waters filled with countless species of fish - including the famous stingrays. Scuba divers can enjoy the coral reefs that stretch for miles around the islands while hikers can experience the beautiful scenery.
